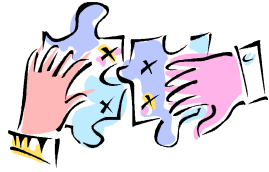

I. Meeting was called to order at 4:05 by Kerrie Albert.

III. Introductions were made.

IV. Report from Chair:

Susan Woodford: NACDAC will be sponsoring the Teens for Change Coalition at the Shrimp Festival parade. There will be a banner and t-shirts, and the teens will hand out their cards.

The Prescription Drug Take Back event will be held on Saturday, April 23 at Publix. Susan asked whether the Sheriff's Office will be involved. A press release will be done.

We are working on several funding sources: a Dreyer's Grant (\$5,000); a MetLife grant (\$15,000) for our community policing program; and a EUDL grant (up to \$55,000) that would be put toward youth leadership.

Per County Commissioner Steve Kelley, we will be receiving prevention money from the Sheriff's Office's confiscated drug money.

We have submitted our third-year budget for our DFC grant. Our logic model was presented to the State, where it is considered a model for the State.

#### V. New Business/Presentation:

The redesigned [www.nadcac.org](http://www.nadcac.org) website was shown. It has a wealth of information and contains links for parents, kids and anyone interested in substance use. If you would like to have a link added or an event or information posted, please let Kerrie Albert know (206-2268).

If you go to the Community section and select Data, you can view the Northeast Florida Planning Council Live Dashboard (Instant Atlas). This site provides trend data for many indicators and is very useful. Please let us know if you want information posted.

Another site that provides helpful data on up to 180 indicators is [www.nefloridacounts.org](http://www.nefloridacounts.org), which is new and will be launched soon. It includes "Promising Practices" (programs that connect to a problem) and the ability to write reports.

Jean Bardes handed out and reviewed the revised Talking Points for Nassau County. These facts can be used when explaining to others the importance of NACDAC's mission.

#### VI. Reports from Agencies/Members:

Sergeant Sanderson: The police department will be conducting DUI patrols for Spring Break and prom. The latest compliance buys had 100% compliance by retail outlets. She is interested in knowing if Yulee High School needs officers to help with their prom.

Kim Clemons: There will be a college fair at the Bean Center tomorrow from 5:00-7:00 p.m. "Sixty Minutes" had a segment on child homelessness, and she can send out the link. She has applied for a grant through the Homeless Coalition to provide shoes, socks and underwear to the homeless. Is anyone able to do a drive? Please contact Kim if you think a student might be homeless, delinquent or neglected. St. Vincent's mobile mammography is coming on April 21 to the west side and on April 22 to the east side. Let her know of any events for her McKinney-Vento Newsletter calendar. Kim reminded everyone that Memorial United Methodist Church is offering a free program for kids during spring break.

Hank Martinez: The Sheriff's Office will be stepping up their patrols for Spring Break.

Kerrie Albert: The Fernandina Beach youth group continues working on school policy and social issues, using their media class. The youth groups in FBHS and Yulee High School are going well.

Donna Martin: She has spoken to Ms. Wood about the alcohol, drug and tobacco policy, and it's on the front burner now.

Susan Silva: DJJ Council meetings are held the second Tuesday of the month at 11:15 a.m. at the Probation Office on Pages Dairy Road. They have a State car that helps with transportation issues. They have gotten approval to add K2 (synthetic drugs) to court orders.

Amy Pipkin: They have been working with Dignity U Wear and received clothes for free and reduced lunch kids. She and Kim talked about partnering regarding clothes for the homeless. Gift cards that they saved from Christmas are being doled out now. Their after-school programs have had the highest rates of attendance ever.

Dr. Seidel (DOH): Kick Butts Day is being held next Tuesday afternoon at Central Park. The Partnership for a Healthier Nassau is having a kickoff meeting on April 14 from 2:00-4:00 p.m. at the Bean Center.
