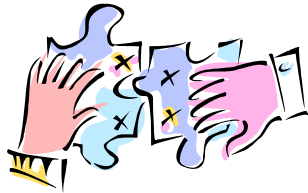

- I. Introduction: Susan Woodford 4:06 call to order
- II. Minutes: Reviewed and approved by Bart Clark, seconded by Jennifer Emmons.
- III. Business: Susan Woodford announced the Success Highways program that will begin in June and will focus on helping high risk students. Curtis Gaus with Dropout Prevention is leading this program. The RTI program at FBHS is still going well; they now have 111 seniors who are participating in the college ready program. Also, with summer right around the corner Community Policing will be increased. The retail merchant training had a good turnout and there will be another one on April 27th. Sergeant Sanderson has been going around to vendors to talk about the vendor training and she has been informing them of the importance of vendor training.

NACDAC is funded by the Federal Government through the State of Florida by the State Incentive Grant, which ends this year. Susan Woodford has met with DCF officials to sign a contract to continue our efforts. The Mentor Grant with Monroe County (Key West) is due on April 23rd. Susan announced we are including stakeholders in this grant. Only 15 grants are awarded nationally, and NACDAC was pushed to apply for this grant. Susan also gave the report from the site visit for our DFC grant; the findings were that we should share our knowledge and experience with other coalitions.

The Shrimp Festival Parade will be on April 29th at 6:00 pm. NACDAC will be in the parade, and all members are invited to walk. We will be passing out "Be the Wall" merchandise. Also, we will be doing Intercept Surveys at the movie theater for "Be the Wall."

Susan Woodford announced we have nominated Sergeant Rhonda Sanderson for the National Law Enforcement Award for Underage Drinking.

Kerrie Albert announced that on May 4th at 4:00 pm we will have a NACDAC meeting on the west side of the county at Sutton Place's Hilliard location. Kerrie also introduced our Community Snapshot and passed around the rough draft for members to review. We plan to distribute the snapshot to community members and agencies.

Jean Bardes introduced the Evaluation Plan about SARG strategies. The plan was distributed and reviewed by the coalition, and questions from members were answered. Susan Woodford reported on one of our capacity goals, to increase our collaboration with the Sheriff's Office, and stated that we still need help from the Sheriff's Office. She also reported on her meeting with the State Attorney's Office to discuss prosecution of adults who provide alcohol to youth and prosecution of youth who do not comply with alcohol laws. She has been meeting with Wes White of the State Attorney's Office, and he seems very interested in working with NACDAC. Susan will be following up with Mr. White.

IV. Reports from agencies and member announcements:

Sharon Dyal, SPBH, expressed concern because there is no follow-through with first offender program, and no one makes sure kids are doing their community service.

Bart Clark, God's Army, discussed plans to run a camp for first offender kids to do community service. Those who do not complete the camp are then put in the system.

Susan Woodford, NACDAC, reported on the Town Hall Meeting. She mentioned that only 3 students raised their hand when asked if parents talked about drinking; the students were more scared of law enforcement than their parents. Students also said the tobacco lung is an effective tool because that is the one thing that stuck out and they remembered. Also, students most frequently drink at home in small groups when their parents are gone. Jennifer Emmons asked if there was any data she could share with parents who think it is ok to give their kids a sip of alcohol while at home. Susan said there was data to help and that she would send her some.

Kim Clemons, NCSA, has sent prom safety tips to high school principals. Kim met with Meg McAlpine (UF) about a grant proposal Meg is working on to bring in a full-time person to talk

to students in schools about nutrition topics. Kim also announced the Empowered Parent Conference at the Methodist Church in Fernandina.

Nick Clark and Chris Goll would like to attend the Enforcing Underage Drinking Laws Conference (EUDL) in Anaheim, CA in August. They want to go because it will better their leadership skills and bring information to help with the youth coalition. The ballpark cost for both of them to attend is \$1,500. The coalition thought it was a good idea to send them and Susan said she will look at the budget.

David Williams, NCSO, reported they had 9 tobacco citations at the schools

Jennifer Emmons, NCHD, announced they had an oral cancer survivor come and speak at West Nassau and the kids had to attend a tobacco citation class. The oral cancer survivor also spoke at Yulee Middle School and Fernandina Beach Middle School.

Susan Woodford asked if anyone wanted to participate in the Environmental Scan Training, which is alcohol related.

Laureen Pagel, SPBH, announced Sutton Place's open-access hours from Monday to Friday and you don't need an appointment. The open-access hours have decreased the no-show rate to zero for intakes and the follow-up no-show rate is down to 10%. Every Tuesday they have open-access for the Medical Clinic patients who have to see a doctor to get prescription refills, and they do not charge children for treatment.

Susan Woodford discussed the need to work on policy change. One policy has to do with social hosting laws, and another is requiring everyone who serves or sells alcohol to attend training. Another policy that needs to be looked at is students only getting 10 days suspension for having alcohol, whereas they get 45 days for marijuana; there needs to be consistency. Susan expressed the desire to discuss this with the School Board, and Donna Martin, School Board member and NACDAC member, said she would help in any way she could. Also, the coalition is going to be highlighted in the News-Leader.

There will be no July meeting.
