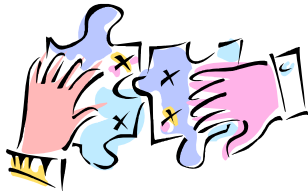

- I. Introduction: Kerrie Albert 4:03 call to order
- II. Minutes: Reviewed and approved by Amy Pipkin, seconded by Jennifer Emmons.
- III. Business:

Kerrie Albert updated everyone on the two ordinances that NACDAC is trying to get passed in the City. The social host ordinance would hold the property owner responsible if alcohol was served to minors, whether adults were present or not. Of funds collected on enforcement of this ordinance, half would go to the city and the other to the coalition. The second ordinance would require establishments that sell or serve alcohol to attend mandatory retail beverage training. Both

ordinance proposals have been discussed with the city manager, state's attorney, mayor, chief of police, and city commissioners. If passed in the city, we will work on the county.

Kerrie also announced NACDAC will be partnering with the Fernandina Beach Police Department for our first Prescription Drug Take Back Program on September 25th in front of Publix from 10 – 2. Kerrie explained we are trying to get money from businesses in the community to use to buy gift cards as incentives for participation.

Kerrie reported that our community policing and compliance buys are still ongoing. NACDAC has purchased a youth problem-solving curriculum to be used at Fernandina Beach High School and Yulee High School in the gifted classes. Kerrie then passed out the Member Interest Inventory and asked members to sign up for the committee that they are interested in. Kerrie described each committee, which includes: Fundraising, Capacity Building, Special Projects, Policy and By Laws, School Board Policies and Student/Youth Committee.

IV. Reports from agencies and member announcements:

Hank Martinez, NCSO, reported they did compliance buys over the summer at convenience stores, restaurants and grocery stores. Out of the 79 compliance buys, 57 were in compliance, for a compliance rate of 72%.

Elizabeth Ledbetter, ABT, updated everyone on Facebook cases where ABT ended up getting an arrest warrant based on Facebook pictures. A club, OASIS, advertised on Facebook, bused kids from Fleming Island and sold alcohol on the bus; ABT made 5 arrests. Elizabeth also reported on ABT's Operation Back to School, where they are doing surveys for colleges and high schools. Curtis Gaus thought it would be beneficial for Elizabeth to participate in our Youth Coalition.

Kim Clemons, NCSB, is now with the Office of Intervention and Prevention as the Homeless Liaison and continues to work with employee wellness. Kim announced that NJRF teacher Debbie Broxton is the Juvenile Justice State Teacher of the Year.

Amy Pipkin, CIS, reported that CIS is trying to become more focused on which at-risk students should be addressed.

Jennifer Emmons, DOH, reported they had tobacco compliance checks and they were 100% compliant. They did have one shoulder tap citation.

Curtis Gaus, NCSB, reported that his partnership with the coalition on Success Highways ended up being very successful.

Becky DeBerry, Journey Church, is new to the coalition and is the student pastor at Journey Church. She has been working with students for 13 years. Kim Clemons asked about the Journey Church's Virtual School. Becky explained the virtual school is a co-op assisting home school parents two days a week.

Susan Silva, DJJ, announced she knew Mike Branden who is the Director of drug dogs and that he will come and check schools for free.
