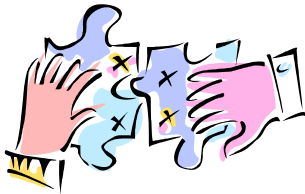

**Introductions were made by members:**

**David Bishop, FBPD, informed everyone that compliance checks were made and they were 100% compliant.**

**Glenn Ellison, Parent Coach, explained that he works with parents and he won't work with the kids unless the parents too are ready to work. He requires the parents to attend a skill training program and also go to Camp Consequence. If the parents are willing to work, then Glenn's program can help kids improve school performance, get them to do their homework, stop outbursts of anger, and obey house rules. **Brent Alberta, God's Army Ministry, discussed their ministry and explained that it was a faith-based program and that they are opening up a building for youth to go and participate in various events, such as weekly bible studies and cookouts. God's Army is focused on reaching out to the community to help in whatever capacity they are able to. Recently they have been speaking to various organizations in the community.**

**IV. Presentation:**

**MaryRuth Murray on Hip Hop: Hip Hop started as a positive and creative outlet that empowered the youth and helped the community. There are two different parts of hip hop: old school and new school.**

**Old School Hip Hop focused on making good music and empowering youth. Some of the old school hip hop promoted education and learning about your history and culture.**

**New School Hip Hop talks about money, fame, sex, drugs and partying. Many people – even sports teams and talk shows – play certain new school hip hop songs, even though their lyrics are objectionable, possibly because they do not understand the meaning of the lyrics. MaryRuth passed around the words to one new school hip hop song and reviewed what some of the words in new school hip hop actually mean.**

**Two-thirds of all Hip Hop is purchased by Non – African Americans.**
