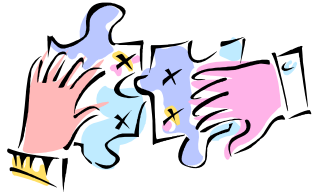

- I. Introduction: Kerrie Albert 4:05 call to order
- II. Minutes: Reviewed and approved by Rhonda Sanderson, seconded by Amy Pipkin
- III. Business: Susan Woodford announced she and Kerrie Albert will be having a second meeting with Wes White to discuss the city social host ordinance that was drafted. Mr. White seems very interested in backing us up with that and he is trying to be more proactive. Susan explained that the social host ordinance was modeled after one from Arizona; the first offense for adults will result in a \$1,000 fine, and juveniles will get community service. In addition, Susan spoke with the city attorney, who also seems to be on board. NACDAC is requesting that half of the \$1,000 fine goes to the coalition to help support prevention programs.

Kerrie Albert reported that NACDAC is working on school policy issues and would like to get the principals' approval. Kerrie is trying to get on the agenda for the principals' meeting. The goal would be to get alternatives to student suspension.

Mary Obenauf reported that at Callahan Middle School students are dealing snuff and Mary is working to speak to the students about tobacco before school starts.

Kerrie and Susan have been trying to get the word out about NACDAC around the community. They have spoken at the Rotary Club and also went to Bryceville. Kerrie went and spoke to the Camden County Coalition and they are interested in cooperating with us. Kerrie has been distributing the community snapshot and the response has been very good. Susan Woodford also announced that currently she is looking at a grant to pay for School Resource Officers.

Jean Bardes discussed the NACDAC website and our plans to improve it. Jean asked the coalition for any ideas or suggestions to help improve the website.

#### Reports from agencies and member announcements:

Rhonda Sanderson, FBPD, reported that for the month of May they worked prom and had no problems until a late night house party, and they also had 2 tobacco citations. Seven DUI patrols were done and there were 6 DUI arrests. They also had an underage drinker at the Palace who used her friend's ID; both girls were arrested. There was a party at a hotel where a family from Georgia hosted and supplied alcohol to minors; all 4 adults were arrested. The officers poured out all the alcohol, and no parents responded to the phone calls. They also had 2 DUI arrests where both were 19 years old and they were at the same establishment and were not carded. There were 84 Beach Patrol warnings to adults but no underage. For the month of June they provided security for adult education at First Baptist Church and had 6 tobacco citations, 2 of which gave false info and got arrested. Finally, DUI patrol got a 19 year old with prescription drugs.

Mary Obenauf, NCHD, reported they did get the funding to support tobacco compliance buys. Mary also announced that ABT got involved with a situation involving the tobacco vending machine at the Surf and now they no longer have the machine.

Susan Woodford mentioned that the social host ordinance also includes an Unruly Gathering ordinance, which will give flexibility for law enforcement to enter a house. Rhonda Sanderson announced she spoke with the Chief about starting a hotline for house parties.

Susan Silva, DJJ, announced that on Thursday from 2-4 DJJ is having an open house.

Laureen Pagel, SPBH, reported they are losing their Safe and Drug Free School grant and stated that open access is five days a week. Susan Woodford asked if Sutton Place tracks the revisits by clients and Laureen said they did not.

Amy Pipkin, CIS, is beginning their summer remediation.

Susan Woodford announced that the Prevention Conference is September 29 – October 1<sup>st</sup> and asked if anyone would like to go. Jean Bardes, Amy Pipkin, Susan Silva, and Rhonda Sanderson said they would all like to attend.

Mary Obenauf asked if anyone would be interested in being trained for tobacco cessation classes for teens. It is only 6 classes and the materials are supplied.

There will be no NACDAC meeting in July. The next meeting is August 17, 2010.
