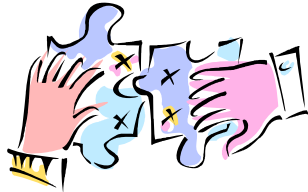

- I. Introduction: Rhonda Sanderson 4:00 call to order
- II. Minutes: Reviewed and approved by Amy Pipkin, seconded by Jennifer Emmons
- III. Business: Susan Woodford reported that the environmental scans were completed; there was a total of 96 and it was a good opportunity to connect with the establishments that serve or sell alcohol. We also helped the tobacco coalition by completing tobacco surveys at several establishments.

Susan gave an update on the Youth Coalition. We will be partnering with Flagler County to form a youth problem solving coalition at Yulee Middle School. The problem solving curriculum will be administered in the gifted classes. In addition, there is a possibility to team up with Flagler in international problem solving and go

to Costa Rica. Kim Clemons asked if we could keep Mr. Powell updated with any Youth Coalition developments.

Susan also reported some upcoming meetings with the school board and also with Wes White. The school board meetings will focus on policy changes and the meeting with Wes White is about prosecutions, with the main issue being providing alcohol to minors.

Rhonda Sanderson gave an update on a trial where an adult hosted a house party and two kids were killed in St. Johns County. Elizabeth Ledbetter, ABT, recalled working on the particular case and received a lot of information on Facebook; she also mentioned that she thinks this trial will set a precedent.

IV. Reports from agencies and member announcements:

Kim Clemons, NCSB, reported that she will probably no longer be working with safe and drug free schools next year, unless something changes. If this is the case, she will be working on employee wellness. She will be going to Tallahassee to receive an award for Florida Healthy School District and will be granted \$750 that she would like to see go towards "Red Ribbon Week." Kim also reported that nearly 1,100 kids took the Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey this year, which is a great improvement.

Jennifer Emmons, NCHD, reported they have two kids in their citation classes and that the enrollment numbers start to drop towards the end of the school year.

Susan Woodford, NACDAC, announced we will be doing intercept surveys at the movie theater and we are looking for volunteers to help.

Curtis Gaus, NCSB, recently conducted Success Highways training with groups of teachers, and the training introduced a dropout prevention curriculum for high schools.

Elizabeth Ledbetter, ABT, announced that ABT will be working proms and also reported they worked the Shrimp Festival and did not have any problems. Elizabeth also introduced the "Red Eye Purple Flake" that is sold for entertainment purposes and is banned in most states, but not Florida. It looks like marijuana and people do smoke it. After having it tested, the results said it was synthetic THC and it was being sold as incense. She also reported that ABT is gearing up for their busiest season with prom and graduation. Susan Woodford asked if ABT could do compliance checks on the West side of the county; Elizabeth said ABT would work on it.

Sarah Clinton, SPBH, discussed an incident at West Nassau that involved a student who was clearly under the influence and also admitted to taking Xanax; they also found crushed-up Xanax on his desk. Sarah contacted the SRO who talked to the

student for about an hour and then let the student go with no consequences. The student just wandered around school causing several disturbances. Sarah then spoke with the Vice Principal about consistency with policies. When nothing was done, she spoke with the Principal, who had not been informed of this problem, and the student's parents were called. Kim Clemons mentioned she thought it was a good time with the school board to focus on consistency with drug and alcohol policy.

David Williams, NCSO, reported 5 tobacco citations and there were several teens sent to teen court. They also found a teen with vicodin.

Amy Pipkin, CIS, announced she spoke with a limo driver at Winn Dixie about not buying alcohol for kids at the prom. The main problem is the adults that stock the limo for the students.

Susan Woodford, NACDAC, reported in two weeks the community policing program will be highlighted. In addition, NACDAC will be getting direct funding from DCF; it is the first time a coalition is being funded, and they will be signing the contract next week. Susan also announced that on June 1st we will have a coalition meeting on the west side of the county.

Rhonda Sanderson, FBPD, reported having a good turnout for the retail training. Also, people in violation will no longer get a notice to appear in court, but will be taken to jail. They also cited a bar owner for staying open until 3:30 a.m., and he only received a fine of \$68.
